Knighted Knave

Knighted Knave Judging at June Meeting "Big Brew Day 2018"

With the shuffling of schedules, we judged the next round of the Knighted Knave intra-club competition. This round of the competition didn't focus on a single style as it often does, instead this time we judged all beers made from

the same starting wort according to whatever the end style was. Everyone was very creative with the base (Prairie Path) wort, we had beers ranging from several IPA styles, all the way to a coffee stout.

All 15 judges sampled all 8 entries, so we used a LOT of cups but we were able to find a winner. All of the beers were evaluated in a Best of Show format where each beer is judged as what is the best example of what it is supposed to be. Each judge then votes for their top 3 beers, 1st gets 3 points, 2nd gets 2 points and 3rd gets 1 point. We had a tie for 3rd place, just one point behind 2nd, so we had some competition, but the Cup Winner ran away with it with 26 points (10 points ahead of 2nd).

Congratulations to Kevin "Woj" Wojdak for his winning NEIPA! He will be awarded the Knighted Knave Cup at the next meeting and the next round of the Cup will be announced later this year!

Our 2017 participation involved pouring our homebrew at 3 different events in Lake Zurich, Lombard, and Racine (WI) bringing more awareness about our brewing and the club to the community. Tour of a Vanilla FarmBy Mike and Eileen Uchima

In early May, Eileen and I spent a few days in the Kona area (Western coast) of the Big Island of Hawaii. (No, we didn't see any lava, but we felt the magnitude 6.9 earthquake which preceded most of the volcanic activity!)

One of the interesting things we did while we were there was tour a small vanilla farm, *The Vanillerie*, just outside town. JR, the farm manager, was very



friendly and personally gave us a private tour of the facility, explaining in great detail how vanilla farming is done.

What we call vanilla beans are actually the seed pod (fruit) of the vanilla orchid, a tropical vine. The

farm we toured grows them under large open structures which are covered with shade cloth to simulate the vanilla orchid's native habitat, the shady understory of the rain forest. New vines are propagated via cuttings, and can take several years before they start to produce fruit.

Each individual flower on the vanilla orchid must be pollinated by hand to ensure that a fruit is produced; this is done by using a toothpick to transfer the pollen from the anther to the stigma of the blossom. Since each blossom is open for only a day or so, JR must check every day for new blossoms to pollinate, using stilts to reach the highest ones.



Since the vanilla fruit do not all ripen at the same time, picking must also be done frequently, and by hand. But wait, there's more – growing and picking the fruit is only half of the process!

When picked, the fruit is soft and green – not at all like the vanilla beans you normally see for sale. Proper curing to develop the characteristic aroma and flavor is a month-long process involving multiple steps of heating, drying, and aging the fruit in a controlled temperature and humidity environment.

The tour was a fascinating glim pse into an industry I



previously knew nothing about. I also understand now why real vanilla is – ounce for ounce – the second most expensive flavoring in the world,



after saffron. (It also isn't helping that the vanilla harvest of the world's largest producer, Madagascar, has been far below normal for 2 out of the past 3 years.)

Something to think about the next time you have vanilla ice cream, or add vanilla to a specialty ale!
