Christmas Beer Roulette

In 2020, we had a dozen members play "Christmas Beer Roulette" and we had a lot of fun doing it. So, we're playing again in 2021!

Given the 2020 situation we had, we held an outdoor gathering and, while it was chilly, we had heaters and plenty of beverages to keep us warm. For 2021, we'll do the exchange live at the Club Holiday Party at Two Brothers Roundhouse.



Basics

Bring a 6-pack of your Christmas beer, mead, or cider to the exchange and leave with a mixed 6-pack of your fellow UKG member's Christmas brews. A key will be

distributed after the gathering so it's not a complete mystery what 6 brews you have in your 6-pack.

The How-To Explanation

On our designated meetup day, each participant club member brings a 6-pack of all of **"one" style** of their Christmas or other Special beer, mead, or cider to the party. At check-in, you sign in and note the beverage name and description of what you brought.

To facilitate anonymity and make this a mystery for everyone, Woj will assign your 6-pack a number and give you a note with your number so, you can claim your pack at the end once all mixed 6-packs have been created. Your bottles will also be assigned a number and the plan is that you go home with a set of completely random bottles with none of your own and no doubles.

You share brews with fellow club members at the gathering while the packs are organized.

When all participants have checked in, we'll use a random number generation program to select brews to fill the 6-packs making sure to not include the brewers own brew in his/her pack. The more brewers we have participating, the more random the 6-packs will end up.

After all packs have been created, we each grab our 6-pack and continue to socialize.

Hopefully, you're already planning your brews for the holidays and are willing to share a 6-pack with your fellow club members.

Location to be determined but date will be Tuesday, December 21st at our Club Christmas Party to make our exchange. If you cannot make it but want to participate, make arrangements with a fellow UKG'er to bring your beer.








Brewery Review

Fort George Brewery
Astoria, OR

At the Northwest tip of Oregon is Astoria, a small touristy town a short distance from Fort Stevens State Park. It is located on the Pacific ocean at the mouth of the Columbia river. Where there are tourists, there are breweries... four in this town. The breweries are **Buoy Beer Company**, **Astoria Brewing**, **Reach Brewing**, and **Fort George Brewery**.

Three blocks up the hillside from the Columbia River basin in Astoria is the Fort George Brewery "campus" which occupies 2 large 1920's industrial buildings separated by a courtyard; also part of the brewery. One building serves primarily as the food service operation while the other contains the production brewery.

The restaurant building has multiple floors of seating as well as a rooftop and outside deck. The brewery building houses a small taproom separated from the fermenters and brewhouse by a makeshift rope line. There's virtually no seating in there as they assume you'll drink your beer in the adjoining courtyard.

Beers I sampled:

- Barrel-fermented Pilsner Fruity, sweet, flat. Is this a lager or an ale?
- Pale Ale 5.2% hop forward. Bright hop character with clean bitter finish.
- Red 6.2% low hop character, predominant honey and caramel notes.
- Stout 8.8% toffee dominates, sweet finish. More like a Robust Porter.



Pluto Beer Gun

I was serving homebrewed Irish Extra Stout at a party recently when my picnic tap failed. Fortunately I brought a backup picnic tap but I've had a couple fail. Both picnic taps failed at the hinge pin which prevented dispensing beer.

In search of a picnic tap replacement, I came across the **Pluto Beer Gun**. It comes in two styles:

- Nylon exterior with stainless steel internals for under \$15.
- A stainless steel exterior and internals for under \$45.

I selected the nylon exterior style since I only use it when dispensing beer on tap remotely. The beer gun feels solid and there is an adjustable flow control valve.

Although I recently received it, I haven't had a chance to do a long term test. So far I am pleased with my Pluto which is a definite improvement over my picnic tap.

FYI, Torpedo Keg makes an all stainless steel picnic tap for \$25 but like the plastic picnic taps they do not have an adjustable flow control valve.
